HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES



November 19, 2013

Unfinished Business

- We discussed the outcome of the congregational vote. The project donation envelopes have been placed in the pews. Updates on the financial status of the projects will be printed in the bulletins.
- The new copy machine has been installed and training has been conducted. We will be keeping the old machine until it fails.
- Heather Ohm will be covering the office during Marcia's personal time-off. Heather and Pastor Doug will work out a schedule. Jayne Frahm will be printing out checks and Bev Junker will be making the offering deposits. After discussion, Josh Hamann made a motion and Kevin Mussman seconded it, to pay substitute secretaries at a rate of \$12/hour; motion carried.
- We discussed purchasing a new paper folding machine. We agreed to discuss this further after more information is gathered.
- The Petty Cash reconciliation will be worked on after Marcia returns.

New Business

- After requests from members to have a program to offer community service hours for students, we decided now would not be the right time to offer this program. We did not believe there would be enough work to offer anyone and we were not sure who would supervise the program.
- We will continue to search for the last vacancy for the Council members.
- After discussion of the annual fees for copyright licensure, we decided that Pastor Doug should see if there are different types of coverage and to ask other churches what type of coverage they have.

- Linda Neidlinger has brought to our attention that the church does not have an AED machine. She informed us that they can cost between \$1200 -- \$2500. She also stated that there are grants to help churches get funds to purchase the device and she is willing to apply for one for us.

Committee Reports

- Board of Christian Education: the board is looking for four new members; the Christmas Program will be on December 8th during church; Sunday school attendance has increased; 60 Operation Christmas Child boxes were packaged.
- Memorial Committee: donated \$5,000 to help cover the cost of the copy machine.
- Missions Committee: Thanksgiving baskets will be packed and distributed on November 23rd and will include and \$50 Target gift card for each child and a \$25 gift card from Berkots; the committee reviewed their budget and made a few changes to be considered by the Budget Committee; will be working on an Angola project in the spring; clean-up buckets, personal care items, school bags and baby items will once again be collected for Church World Service.
- Property and Maintenance: will be re-glazing the parsonage picture windows; Berklow Construction will be doing the roofs in May, however they will come out soon to complete any patches; Alex Meyer will do the tuck-pointing; the parsonage front door was weather stripped, a new front door is becoming difficult to order due to the size.

Council members are the December Council Person of the Month. The next meeting is on Tuesday, December 17, 2013 at 7:00 pm. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

THE PASTOR'S NOTE

Normal Families By Martin B. Copenhaver

Rebekah called her younger son Jacob and said to him, "Your brother is consoling himself by planning to kill you. Flee at once to my brother Laban in Haran, and stay with him a while—until your brother's anger against you turns away, and he forgets what you have done to him." - Genesis 27:42-25

In a town called Normal, Illinois, there is a lovely sculpture in a park that features a husband and wife embracing and looking lovingly into each other's eyes, while their young children sit contented on their laps. The sculpture is entitled, "The Normal Family."

The only trouble with that image of family life is that none of us live in a place that could be described as Normal. That may be why that sculpture is regularly vandalized—the vandals are striking out at an idealized image of the family none of us can live up to. As a mother once told me, "The only thing normal in our family is the knob that says Normal on the clothes dryer."

In contrast to that sculpture, the Bible does not hold up an idealized picture of family. Instead, the Bible depicts families with rival siblings and tension between the generations. There is marriage and betrayal, children who refuse to honor their parents and parents who hold back a blessing from their children. There is love expressed in many of the families of the Bible, but there are also heated arguments and stony silences, slow-boiling resentments, and rifts as wide as a canyon.

So when I hear reference to biblical family values, I wonder: are they talking about the rifts and alienation or about the sibling rivalry and bitter resentments?

Catholic author Richard Rohr tells a story of Navajo rug weaving. These beautifully handcrafted rugs are perfectly structured, except for a corner on each rug where an obvious flaw can be found. When he asked why flaws were allowed to remain in such otherwise perfect rugs, he was told, "This is where the spirit moves in and out."

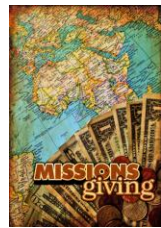
Our families, and the families depicted in the Bible, are far from perfect. They are flawed. Yet it is exactly in those flawed places that the Spirit of God can move and where we can catch a glimpse of grace.

Martin Copenhaver's reflection is important to remember in this season of family gatherings and the celebration of Christmas. May we know the true blessing of Christmas, remembering that the only perfect one is Jesus.

Luke 2:1-20 (New Revised Standard Version)

and on earth peace among those whom he favors!”^[c]

¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.” ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been
